Affidavit of Provisional Voter

Section Reference:

Section 63.011, Texas Election Code

Purpose:

To allow a voter to cast a ballot at the polling place when one or more circumstances surrounding his or her, voter eligibility, presentation of identification or other legal issue prevents the voter from being able to receive a regular ballot. An investigation will be conducted by the Voter Registrar and a determination will be made by the Early Voting Ballot Board whether the voter's ballot is accepted or rejected. After the Early Voting Ballot Board makes its ruling, the voter will receive the Notice of Outcome to Provisional Voter informing him or her whether the ballot was or was not counted.

The Affidavit of Provisional Voter also serves to register the voter at the address he or she provided if the voter was not registered at the time he or she presented to vote at the polling place.

Number of Copies Required:

A copy or scan of the Affidavit of Provisional Voter may be provided to the Voter Registrar when the affidavit envelope is returned to the Early Voting Clerk so that the Voter Registrar may begin the investigation into the voter's circumstances. The original Affidavit of Provisional Voter shall be transferred to the Voter Registrar after the preservation period upon the Voter Registrar's request. [81.175 TAC]

Completed by:

Voter and the Deputy Early Voting Clerk at an Early Voting polling place or Election Judge at an Election Day polling place.

Filing Date:

The Affidavit of Provisional Voter is placed in a secure container for transfer to the Voter Registrar. The specific times for transfer will be determined by the Early Voting Clerk and Voter Registrar.
