Returned to the Voter Registrar in Envelope No. 4 at the same time other election records are delivered to the general custodian of election records.

## **Comments:**

The Voter Registrar corrects the registration records and issues the voter a new certificate.

Voter Registrar retains Statement of Residence on file with voter's registration application.

Voter Registrar is required to provide statements of residence forms to the general custodian of election records in a number equal to at least 10% of the voters in each precinct whose name appears on the list of returned certificates. When the return list is not in use, the voter registrar is required to provide the statements to the general custodian in reasonable quantities for all elections.

Two purposes for the Statement: (1) Voter marked suspense on list of registered voters. Voter votes in old precinct, if otherwise qualified after signing Statement of Residence. The length of time away from precinct is not a factor. (2) Within the same county, voter moves out of precinct and does not change address to new precinct. Voter votes in old precinct if moved. The voter must sign Statement of Residence before voting and must still live in the political subdivision as previous residence address.

If a voter, who is marked suspense on the return list of registered voters, is voting by mail, the statement has to be signed and returned, along with the mail ballot.
