Certification of the Average Closing Price of Gas and Oil - June 2026

The Comptroller of Public Accounts, administering agency for the collection of the Oil Production Tax, has determined, as required by Tax Code, §202.058, that the average taxable price of oil for reporting period June 2026 is \$58.09 per barrel for the three-month period beginning on March 1, 2026, and ending May 31, 2026. Therefore, pursuant to Tax Code, §202.058, oil produced during the month of June 2026, from a qualified low-producing oil lease, is not eligible for credit on the oil production tax imposed by Tax Code, Chapter 202.

The Comptroller of Public Accounts, administering agency for the collection of the Natural Gas Production Tax, has determined, as required by Tax Code, §201.059, that the average taxable price of gas for reporting period June 2026 is \$1.34 per mcf for the three-month period beginning on March 1, 2026, and ending May 31, 2026. Therefore, pursuant to Tax Code, §201.059, gas produced during the month of June 2026, from a qualified low-producing well, is eligible for a 100% credit on the natural gas production tax imposed by Tax Code, Chapter 201.

The Comptroller of Public Accounts, administering agency for the collection of the Franchise Tax, has determined, as required by Tax Code, §171.1011(s), that the average closing price of West Texas Intermediate crude oil for the month of June 2026 is \$81.79 per barrel. Therefore, pursuant to Tax Code, §171.1011(r), a taxable entity shall not exclude total revenue received from oil produced during the month of June 2026, from a qualified low-producing oil well.

The Comptroller of Public Accounts, administering agency for the collection of the Franchise Tax, has determined, as required by Tax Code, §171.1011(s), that the average closing price of gas for the month of June 2026 is \$3.20 per MMBtu. Therefore, pursuant to Tax Code, §171.1011(r), a taxable entity shall exclude total revenue received from gas produced during the month of June 2026, from a qualified low-producing gas well.

Agreed Orders

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ, agency, or commission) staff is providing an opportunity for written public comment on the listed Agreed Orders (AOs) in accordance with Texas Water Code (TWC), §7.075. TWC, §7.075 requires that before the commission may approve the AOs, the commission shall allow the public an opportunity to submit written comments on the proposed AOs. TWC, §7.075 requires that notice of the proposed orders and the opportunity to comment must be published in the *Texas Register* no later than the 30th day before the date on which the public comment period closes, which in this case is **September 7, 2026**. TWC, §7.075 also requires that the commission promptly consider any written comments received and that the commission may withdraw or withhold approval of an AO if a comment discloses facts or considerations that indicate that consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or inconsistent with the requirements of the statutes and rules within the commission's jurisdiction or the commission's orders and permits issued in accordance with the commission's regulatory authority. Additional notice of changes to a proposed AO is not required to be published if those changes are made in response to written comments.

Notice and Opportunity to Comment on Requests for Consistency Agreement/Concurrence Under the Texas Coastal Management Program

On January 10, 1997, the State of Texas received federal approval of the Coastal Management Program (CMP) (62 *Federal Register* pp. 1439 - 1440). Under federal law, federal agency activities and actions affecting the Texas coastal zone must be consistent with the CMP goals and policies identified in 31 TAC Chapter 26. Requests for federal consistency review were deemed administratively complete for the following project(s) during the period of June 25, 2026 to July 24, 2026. As required by federal law, the public is given an opportunity to comment on the consistency of proposed activities in the coastal zone undertaken or authorized by federal agencies. Pursuant to 31 TAC §§30.20(f), 30.30(h), and 30.40(e), the public comment period extends 30 days from the date published on the Texas General Land Office web site. The notice was published on the web site on Friday, July 31, 2026. The public comment period for this project will close at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 30, 2026.

Federal Agency Activities:

Applicant: Department of Homeland Security

Location: Los Fresnos, Cameron County, Texas.

Project Description: The Proposed Action would include the construction of a single-story, prefabricated metal warehouse building measuring 200 x 180 feet. The structure would consist primarily of warehouse storage areas, administrative offices, conference and training rooms, break rooms, as well as various support spaces. The warehouse would be designed and constructed in accordance with applicable Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Facility Design Standards, Building Code requirements, and federal detention facility design criteria.

The proposed warehouse would be located within an already developed portion of the Port Isabel Detention Center (PIDC) facility that has been subject to extensive past disturbance associated with past detention center operations and previous development activities. Construction would occur within the existing secured detention facility footprint and would not require expansion of detention operations beyond the current facility boundary.

Construction activities would include site preparation, grading, excavation, utility installation, foundation construction, placement of a reinforced concrete slab, erection of the prefabricated metal building, installation of building systems, and associated site improvements. Supporting infrastructure would include new parking areas, sidewalks, stormwater drainage features, landscaping, lighting, and utility connections. The warehouse would be connected to the existing electrical, potable water, sanitary sewer, natural gas, communications, and fire protection infrastructure already serving the PIDC facility. No increase in detainee housing capacity would occur as a result of the proposed action.

The Proposed Action would also include installation of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning

(HVAC) systems, fire suppression and alarm systems, plumbing systems, interior finishes, and security features necessary to support warehouse and administrative functions. Drainage improvements would be incorporated into the site design to maintain existing stormwater conveyance patterns and ensure compliance with applicable federal, state, and local regulations. The contractor would be responsible for obtaining all required building permits and approvals for the Proposed Action.

The proposed warehouse would disturb approximately 0.83 terrestrial acres of the PIDC facility grounds. While full plans of this structure have not been fully developed, the structure, ground disturbance, and layout will be consistent with the ICE typical warehouse plan sheets. The project is not expected to disturb more than one acre of land. The project site would be located approximately 2.1 miles west of Laguna Madre and 10.5 miles west of Texas's gulf coastline on South Padre Island.

Project Description: The applicant proposes to discharge 1,468 cubic yards (CY) of concrete and earthen fill material into 0.42 acre of palustrine forested wetland and 0.36 acre of palustrine emergent wetland in association with the expansion of a parking lot for the existing boat launch and park. Additionally, the applicant proposes to discharge 50 CY of fill material into 0.009 acre below the High Tide Line of Cow Bayou in association with the construction and backfilling of a 186-linear-foot bulkhead adjacent to the existing boat ramp. The project also includes the installation of a 133.2-square-foot floating dock, a 112-square-foot access gangway, and a 15-inch-diameter outfall into Cow Bayou.

The applicant has stated that they have avoided and minimized environmental impacts to waters of the United States associated with the proposed activity by expanding an existing facility and utilizing best management practices such as silt fencing. The applicant has proposed to purchase wetland mitigation credits from the Golden Triangle Mitigation Bank to offset unavoidable impacts to waters of the United States. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will determine the type and amount of compensatory mitigation necessary to offset losses of waters of the United States which may result from the proposed activity in accordance with 33 CFR § 332.

A. The name of Scratch Ticket Game No. 2760 is "BINGO TIMES 20". The play style is "bingo".

1.1 Price of Scratch Ticket Game.

A. The price for Scratch Ticket Game No. 2760 shall be \$5.00 per Scratch Ticket.

1.2 Definitions in Scratch Ticket Game No. 2760.

A. Display Printing - That area of the Scratch Ticket outside of the area where the overprint and Play Symbols appear.

B. Latex Overprint - The removable scratch-off covering over the Play Symbols on the front of the Scratch Ticket.

C. Play Symbol - The printed data under the latex on the front of the Scratch Ticket that is used to determine eligibility for a prize. Each Play Symbol is printed in Symbol font in black ink in positive except for dual-image games. D. Play Symbol Caption - The printed material appearing below each Play Symbol which explains the Play Symbol. One caption appears under each Play Symbol and is printed in caption font in black ink in positive. Crossword and Bingo style games do not typically have Play Symbol captions. In this game, only certain Play Symbols have a Play Symbol Caption. The Play Symbol Caption which corresponds with and verifies each Play Symbol is as follows:

E. Serial Number - A unique thirteen (13) digit number appearing under the latex scratch-off covering on the front of the Scratch Ticket. The Serial Number is for validation purposes and cannot be used to play the game. The format will be: 0000000000000.

F. Bar Code - A twenty-four (24) character interleaved two (2) of five (5) Bar Code which will include a four (4) digit game ID, the seven (7) digit Pack number, the three (3) digit Ticket number and the ten (10) digit Validation Number. The Bar Code appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket.

G. Game-Pack-Ticket Number - A fourteen (14) digit number consisting of the four (4) digit game number (2760), a seven (7) digit Pack number, and a three (3) digit Ticket number. Ticket numbers start with 001 and end with 075 within each Pack. The format will be: 2760-0000001-001.

H. Pack - A Pack of the "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game contains 075 Tickets, packed in plastic shrink-wrapping and fanfolded in pages of one (1). Ticket 001 will be shown on the front of the Pack; the back of Ticket 075 will be revealed on the back of the Pack. All Packs will be tightly shrink-wrapped. There will be no breaks between

the Tickets in a Pack. Every other Pack will reverse; i.e., reverse order will be: the back of Ticket 001 will be shown on the front of the Pack and the front of Ticket 075 will be shown on the back of the Pack.

I. Non-Winning Scratch Ticket - A Scratch Ticket which is not programmed to be a winning Scratch Ticket or a Scratch Ticket that does not meet all of the requirements of these Game Procedures, the State Lottery Act (Texas Government Code, Chapter 466), and applicable rules adopted by the Texas Lottery pursuant to the State Lottery Act and referenced in 16 TAC, Chapter 140.

J. Scratch Ticket Game, Scratch Ticket or Ticket - Texas Lottery "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game No. 2760.

2.0 Determination of Prize Winners. The determination of prize winners is subject to the general Scratch Ticket validation requirements set forth in Texas Lottery Rule 140.302, Scratch Ticket Game Rules, these Game Procedures, and the requirements set out on the back of each Scratch Ticket. A prize winner in the "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game is determined once the latex on the Scratch Ticket is scratched off to expose the Play Symbols as indicated per the game instructions from the total of one hundred eighty-one (181) Play Sym-

bols. BINGO TIMES 20 PLAY INSTRUCTIONS: The player completely scratches the "CALLER'S CARD" area and the "5 BONUS NUMBERS" area to reveal a total of twenty-nine (29) Bingo Numbers. The player scratches only those Bingo Numbers on the six (6) "BINGO CARDS" that match the "CALLER'S CARD" Bingo Numbers and the "5 BONUS NUMBERS" Bingo Numbers. The player also scratches the "X20" spaces and the "FREE" spaces on the six (6) "BINGO CARDS". If the player matches all Bingo Numbers in a complete vertical, horizontal or diagonal line (five (5) Bingo Numbers, four (4) Bingo Numbers + "FREE" space, four (4) Bingo Numbers + "X20" space, or three (3) Bingo Numbers + "X20" space + "FREE" space), the player wins the prize in the corresponding prize legend for that "BINGO CARD". If the player matches all Bingo Numbers in all four (4) corners, the player wins the prize in the corresponding prize legend for that "BINGO CARD". If the player matches all Bingo Numbers to complete an "X" (eight (8) Bingo Numbers + "FREE" space), the player wins the prize in the corresponding prize legend for that "BINGO CARD". X20 PLAY INSTRUCTIONS: If a completed LINE pattern in any of the six (6) "BINGO CARDS" contains a "X20" symbol, the player wins 20 TIMES the LINE prize in the corresponding prize legend for that "BINGO CARD". Note: Only the highest prize per "BINGO CARD" will be paid. BONUS GAME PLAY INSTRUCTIONS: If the player reveals 2 matching Play Symbols in the BONUS GAME, the player wins \$20. No portion of the Display Printing nor any extraneous matter whatsoever shall be usable or playable as a part of the Scratch Ticket.

2.1 Scratch Ticket Validation Requirements.

A. To be a valid Scratch Ticket, all of the following requirements must be met:

1. Exactly one hundred eighty-one (181) Play Symbols must appear under the Latex Overprint on the front portion of the Scratch Ticket;
2. Each of the Play Symbols must have a Play Symbol Caption underneath, unless otherwise specified in Table 1, and each Play Symbol must agree with its Play Symbol Caption. Crossword and Bingo style games do not typically have Play Symbol captions;
3. Each of the Play Symbols must be present in its entirety and be fully legible;
4. Each of the Play Symbols must be printed in black ink except for dual image games;
5. The Scratch Ticket shall be intact;
6. The Serial Number and Game-Pack-Ticket Number must be present in their entirety and be fully legible;
7. The Serial Number must correspond, using the Texas Lottery's codes, to the Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket;
8. The Scratch Ticket must not have a hole punched through it, be mutilated, altered, unreadable, reconstituted or tampered with in any manner;
9. The Scratch Ticket must not be counterfeit in whole or in part;
10. The Scratch Ticket must have been issued by the Texas Lottery in an authorized manner;
11. The Scratch Ticket must not have been stolen, nor appear on any list of omitted Scratch Tickets or non-activated Scratch Tickets on file at the Texas Lottery;
12. The Play Symbols, Serial Number and Game-Pack-Ticket Number must be right side up and not reversed in any manner;
13. The Scratch Ticket must be complete and not miscut, and have exactly one hundred eighty-one (181) Play Symbols under the Latex

Overprint on the front portion of the Scratch Ticket, exactly one Serial Number and exactly one Game-Pack-Ticket Number on the Scratch Ticket;

14. The Serial Number of an apparent winning Scratch Ticket shall correspond with the Texas Lottery's Serial Numbers for winning Scratch Tickets, and a Scratch Ticket with that Serial Number shall not have been paid previously;

15. The Scratch Ticket must not be blank or partially blank, misregistered, defective or printed or produced in error;

16. Each of the one hundred eighty-one (181) Play Symbols must be exactly one of those described in Section 1.2.C of these Game Procedures;

17. Each of the one hundred eighty-one (181) Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket must be printed in the Symbol font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; the Scratch Ticket Serial Numbers must be printed in the Serial font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; and the Game-Pack-Ticket Number must be printed in the Game-Pack-Ticket Number font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery;

18. The Display Printing on the Scratch Ticket must be regular in every respect and correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; and

19. The Scratch Ticket must have been received by the Texas Lottery by applicable deadlines.

B. The Scratch Ticket must pass all additional validation tests provided for in these Game Procedures, the Texas Lottery's Rules governing the award of prizes of the amount to be validated, and any confidential validation and security tests of the Texas Lottery.

C. Any Scratch Ticket not passing all of the validation requirements is void and ineligible for any prize and shall not be paid. However, the Executive Director of the Texas Lottery ("Executive Director") may, solely at the Executive Director's discretion, refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket. In the event a defective Scratch Ticket is purchased, the only responsibility or liability of the Texas Lottery shall be to replace the defective Scratch Ticket with another unplayed Scratch Ticket in that Scratch Ticket Game (or a Scratch Ticket of equivalent sales price from any other current Texas Lottery Scratch Ticket Game) or refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket, solely at the Executive Director's discretion.

2.2 Programmed Game Parameters.

A. GENERAL: Consecutive Non-Winning Tickets within a Pack will not have matching patterns, in the same order, of either Play Symbols or Prize Symbols.

B. GENERAL: A Ticket can win as indicated by the prize structure.

C. GENERAL: A Ticket can win up to six (6) times.

D. BONUS GAME: Winning Tickets will contain two (2) matching Play Symbols in the "BONUS GAME" play area and will win as per the prize structure.

E. BINGO: The number range used for each letter (B,I,N,G,O) will be as follows: B (1-15), I (16-30), N (31-45), G (46-60) and O (61-75).

F. BINGO: On winning and Non-Winning Tickets, there will be no matching "CALLER'S CARD" or "5 BONUS NUMBERS" Play Symbols.

G. BINGO: Each of the "CALLER'S CARD" and "5 BONUS NUMBERS" Play Symbols will appear on at least one (1) of the six (6) "BINGO CARDS".

H. BINGO: Each "BINGO CARD" will contain twenty-three (23) numbers, one (1) "FREE" Play Symbol fixed in the center of the CARD and one (1) "X20" Play Symbol.

I. BINGO: The "I20" CALLER'S CARD and 5 BONUS NUMBERS Play Symbols will never appear in the "CALLER'S CARD" or the "5 BONUS NUMBERS" play areas.

J. BINGO: The "20" BINGO CARDS Play Symbol will never appear on a "BINGO CARD".

K. BINGO: There will be no matching Play Symbols on each "BINGO CARD" play area.

L. BINGO: The "X20" Play Symbol will appear one (1) time per "BINGO CARD" but will never appear in a corner or inside the "X" pattern of a "BINGO CARD".

M. BINGO: The "X20" Play Symbol will win 20 TIMES the prize and will win as per the prize structure.

N. BINGO: Prizes for "BINGO CARDS" 1-6 are as follows:

CARD 1: LINE=\$5. 4 CORNERS=\$20. X=\$100.

CARD 2: LINE=\$10. 4 CORNERS=\$25. X=\$200.

CARD 3: LINE=\$15. 4 CORNERS=\$50. X=\$400.

CARD 4: LINE=\$20. 4 CORNERS=\$100. X=\$500.

CARD 5: LINE=\$25. 4 CORNERS=\$300. X=\$1,000.

CARD 6: LINE=\$50. 4 CORNERS=\$500. X=\$100,000.

O. BINGO: Each "BINGO CARD" on a Ticket will be different. Two (2) cards match if they have the same number Play Symbols in the same spots.

P. BINGO: Non-winning "BINGO CARDS" will match a minimum of three (3) number Play Symbols.

Q. BINGO: There can only be one (1) winning pattern on each "BINGO CARD".

2.3 Procedure for Claiming Prizes.

A. To claim a "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$5.00, \$10.00, \$15.00, \$20.00, \$25.00, \$30.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$200, \$300, \$400 or \$500, a claimant shall sign the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated on the Scratch Ticket and may present the winning Scratch Ticket to any Texas Lottery Retailer. The Texas Lottery Retailer shall verify the claim and, if valid, and upon presentation of proper identification, if appropriate, make payment of the amount due the claimant and physically void the Scratch Ticket; provided that the Texas Lottery Retailer may, but is not required, to pay a \$25.00, \$30.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$200, \$300, \$400 or \$500 Scratch Ticket Game. In the event the Texas Lottery Retailer cannot verify the claim, the Texas Lottery Retailer shall provide the claimant with a claim form and instruct the claimant on how to file a claim with the Texas Lottery. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, a check shall be forwarded to the claimant in the amount due. In the event the claim is not validated, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly. A claimant may also claim any of the above prizes under the procedure described in Section 2.3.B and Section 2.3.C of these Game Procedures.

B. To claim a "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$1,000 or \$100,000, the claimant must sign the winning Scratch Ticket and may present it at one of the Texas Lottery's Claim Centers. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, payment will be made to

the bearer of the validated winning Scratch Ticket for that prize upon presentation of proper identification. When paying a prize of \$600 or more, the Texas Lottery shall file the appropriate income reporting form with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and shall withhold federal income tax at a rate set by the IRS if required. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

C. As an alternative method of claiming a "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game prize, the claimant may submit the signed winning Scratch Ticket and a thoroughly completed claim form via mail. If a prize value is \$1,000,000 or more, the claimant must also provide proof of Social Security number or Taxpayer Identification (for U.S. Citizens or Resident Aliens). Mail all to: Texas Lottery, P.O. Box 16600, Austin, Texas 78761-6600. The Texas Lottery is not responsible for Scratch Tickets lost in the mail. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

D. Prior to payment by the Texas Lottery of any prize, the Texas Lottery shall deduct the amount of a delinquent tax or other money from the winnings of a prize winner who has been finally determined to be:

1. delinquent in the payment of a tax or other money to a state agency and that delinquency is reported to the Comptroller under Government Code §403.055;
 2. in default on a loan made under Chapter 52, Education Code;
 3. in default on a loan guaranteed under Chapter 57, Education Code; or
 4. delinquent in child support payments in the amount determined by a court or a Title IV-D agency under Chapter 231, Family Code.
- E. If a person is indebted or owes delinquent taxes to the State, other than those specified in the preceding paragraph, the winnings of a person shall be withheld until the debt or taxes are paid.

2.4 Allowance for Delay of Payment. The Texas Lottery may delay payment of the prize pending a final determination by the Executive Director, under any of the following circumstances:

- A. if a dispute occurs, or it appears likely that a dispute may occur, regarding the prize;
- B. if there is any question regarding the identity of the claimant;
- C. if there is any question regarding the validity of the Scratch Ticket presented for payment; or
- D. if the claim is subject to any deduction from the payment otherwise due, as described in Section 2.3.D of these Game Procedures. No liability for interest for any delay shall accrue to the benefit of the claimant pending payment of the claim.

2.5 Payment of Prizes to Persons Under 18. If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize under \$600 from the "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deliver to an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian a check or warrant in the amount of the prize payable to the order of the minor.

2.6 If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize of \$600 or more from the "BINGO TIMES 20" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deposit the amount of the prize in a custodial bank account, with an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian serving as custodian for the minor.

2.7 Scratch Ticket Claim Period. All Scratch Ticket prizes must be claimed within 180 days following the end of the Scratch Ticket Game or within the applicable time period for certain eligible military personnel as set forth in Texas Government Code §466.408. Any rights to a

prize that is not claimed within that period, and in the manner specified in these Game Procedures and on the back of each Scratch Ticket, shall be forfeited.

2.8 Disclaimer. The number of prizes in a game is approximate based on the number of Scratch Tickets ordered. The number of actual prizes available in a game may vary based on number of Scratch Tickets manufactured, testing, distribution, sales and number of prizes claimed. A Scratch Ticket Game may continue to be sold even when all the top prizes have been claimed.

3.0 Scratch Ticket Ownership.

A. Until such time as a signature is placed upon the back portion of a Scratch Ticket in the space designated, a Scratch Ticket shall be owned by the physical possessor of said Scratch Ticket. When a signature is placed on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated, the player whose signature appears in that area shall be the owner of the

Scratch Ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto. Notwithstanding any name or names submitted on a claim form, the Executive Director shall make payment to the player whose signature appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated. If more than one name appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket, the Executive Director will require that one of those players whose name appears thereon be designated by such players to receive payment.

B. The Texas Lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Scratch Tickets and shall not be required to pay on a lost or stolen Scratch Ticket.

4.0 Number and Value of Scratch Prizes. There will be approximately 17,280,000 Scratch Tickets in Scratch Ticket Game No. 2760. The approximate number and value of prizes in the game are as follows:

Request for Proposals - Fiscal Year 2027 Clean Water Act §319(h) Nonpoint Source Grant Program

This request for proposals (RFP) provides instructions and guidance for applicants seeking funding from the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board (TSSWCB) under the Clean Water Act (CWA) §319(h) Nonpoint Source (NPS) Grant Program. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) distributes funds appropriated by Congress annually to the TSSWCB under the authorization of CWA §319(h). TSSWCB then administers/awards these federal funds as grants to cooperating entities for activities that address the goals, objectives, and priorities stated in the *Texas NPS Management Program*. The *Texas NPS Management Program* is the State's comprehensive strategy to protect and restore water quality in waterbodies impacted by NPS water pollution. This document can be accessed online at <https://www.tsswcb.texas.gov/programs/texas-nonpoint-source-management-program>.

The types of agricultural and silvicultural NPS pollution prevention and abatement activities that can be funded with §319(h) grants include the following: (1) implementation of nine-element watershed protection plans (WPPs) and the agricultural and silvicultural NPS portion of Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Implementation Plans (I-Plans); (2) surface water quality monitoring, data analysis and modeling, demonstration of innovative best management practices (BMPs); (3) technical assistance to landowners for conservation planning; (4) public outreach/education, development of nine-element WPPs including the formation and facilitation of stakeholder groups; and (5) monitoring activities to determine the effectiveness of specific pollution prevention methods. Strictly research activities are not eligible for §319(h) grant funding.

The TSSWCB is requesting proposals for watershed assessment, planning, implementation, demonstration, and education projects within the boundaries of impaired or threatened watersheds. The Texas Integrated Report of Surface Water Quality (<https://www.tceq.texas.gov/waterquality/assessment>) describes the water quality conditions for waterbodies in the state. All proposals must focus on the restoration and protection of water quality consistent with the goals, objectives,

and priority watersheds and aquifers identified in Appendix C and D of the *Texas NPS Management Program*. Up to \$1 million of the TSSWCB's FY2027 CWA §319(h) grant will be eligible for award under this RFP. No more than 10% of these funds may be utilized for groundwater projects. A competitive proposal process will be used so that the most appropriate and effective projects are selected for available funding.
